To REPUBLICAN legislators

In January, 2024, the Lt. Governor's Work Force report said dependable transportation to and from jobs and training is needed to build a stronger Alabama work force and economy. Yet elsewhere Alabama is reported the ONLY state dedicating NO state funding to public transit!

This means that we are missing out on millions of federal transit dollars available in 4-1 federal-state matching grants—even as thousands of Alabama citizens lack dependable access not just to jobs and training, but also to worship, shopping, healthcare, recreation, and tourism!

Now Senate Bill 11 has been pre-filed for the 2025 session. Please be on the lookout for this bill and give it careful thought. Please vote for state transit funding! I hope too you'll consider signing on as a cosponsor.

To DEMOCRATIC legislators
